

With *Clarity: Inclusion in Action*, we are extending this same commitment internationally — partnering to deliver meaningful, sustainable change in Sierra Leone.

Why This Matters

Sierra Leone, still recovering from a civil war that ended in 2002, remains one of the world's most under-resourced countries. In rural areas such as Kambia District, children face limited access to education, healthcare, and basic infrastructure.

For young people living with disabilities, these challenges are compounded by stigma, social exclusion, and the lack of accessible services. Many are also orphans, relying on overstretched families or fragile community networks for survival.

The need is significant, but the drive for change is strong. Communities are asking not for handouts, but for the tools and opportunities to build a better future.

A Local Partnership with Global Reach



At Clarity, we know that sustainable impact is only possible when it is led from within communities themselves. That is why we have partnered with WESOFOD (Welfare Society for the Disabled) — a highly respected, locally-led and disability-run organisation based in Sierra Leone's Kambia District.

For over two decades, WESOFOD has been recognised as a pioneering voice in disability inclusion. Founded and operated by people living with disabilities, the organisation has a unique ability to connect with those most often left at the margins, while also influencing policymakers and service providers. Their deep community roots mean they are trusted by families, educators, and local authorities alike.

MAIN PURPOSE

By working alongside WESOFOD, Clarity ensures that every investment is community-led, culturally relevant, and designed for long-term sustainability. This partnership allows us to combine global expertise and resources with local insight and leadership — ensuring our collective efforts have both immediate and lasting impact.

Together, we are not only delivering support — we are building systems of resilience and dignity that will outlast any single project or intervention.

Our Flagship Project: Clarity House

Clarity House will be a safe, accessible hub in Kambia, Sierra Leone. It will provide a base for healthcare teams, teachers, and social workers to reach children and families who are otherwise excluded from vital services.

It will also serve as a centre for training and advocacy. Local leaders, disability networks, and community groups will use the space to build capacity, challenge stigma, and drive inclusion across healthcare, education, and governance.

Act as a hub for outreach across 12 surrounding villages — the foundation of a growing "Village of Hope."

Connected through parent networks and women's groups for support and protection.


Commitment in Action



Clarity has already committed the full funding required to build and complete Clarity House. Construction is underway, and this milestone project will soon provide a permanent, accessible base for healthcare workers, educators, and disability advocates serving Kambia District.

In November, a delegation of five Clarity team members will travel to Sierra Leone to officially open Clarity House.







SUPPORTING WESOFOD

This visit will not only mark the opening ceremony, but also demonstrate our ongoing, hands-on partnership. During their time in Sierra Leone, our team will spend time directly with the communities and villages supported by WESOFOD — listening, learning, and contributing skills and capacity. This reflects our belief that real inclusion is not charity from afar, but active, lived partnership on the ground.

FOOTBALL KITS

We are inviting donations of football kits and shirts in any size or team colours.

These will be shared with local youth teams, schools, and inclusive play groups — helping children and young people experience the joy of sport, teamwork, and belonging.

UNUSED TECH

We're also collecting unused but working technology — such as laptops, tablets, and mobile phones (with chargers) — to support education, communication, and skills training. Even older devices, if in working order, can open up new opportunities for learning and connection.

EVERY DAY ITEMS

In addition we need thoughtful items that can make a real difference to everyday life, including medicines, clothes and bras, perfumes, jewellery, and shoes or sneakers — small contributions that bring comfort, dignity, and joy to the communities we support.
